WATER 3X PER WEEK, NEVER ON SUNDAYS

It's time to change your watering clocks! March ushers in the Spring watering schedule from the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA), continuing from now until April 30.

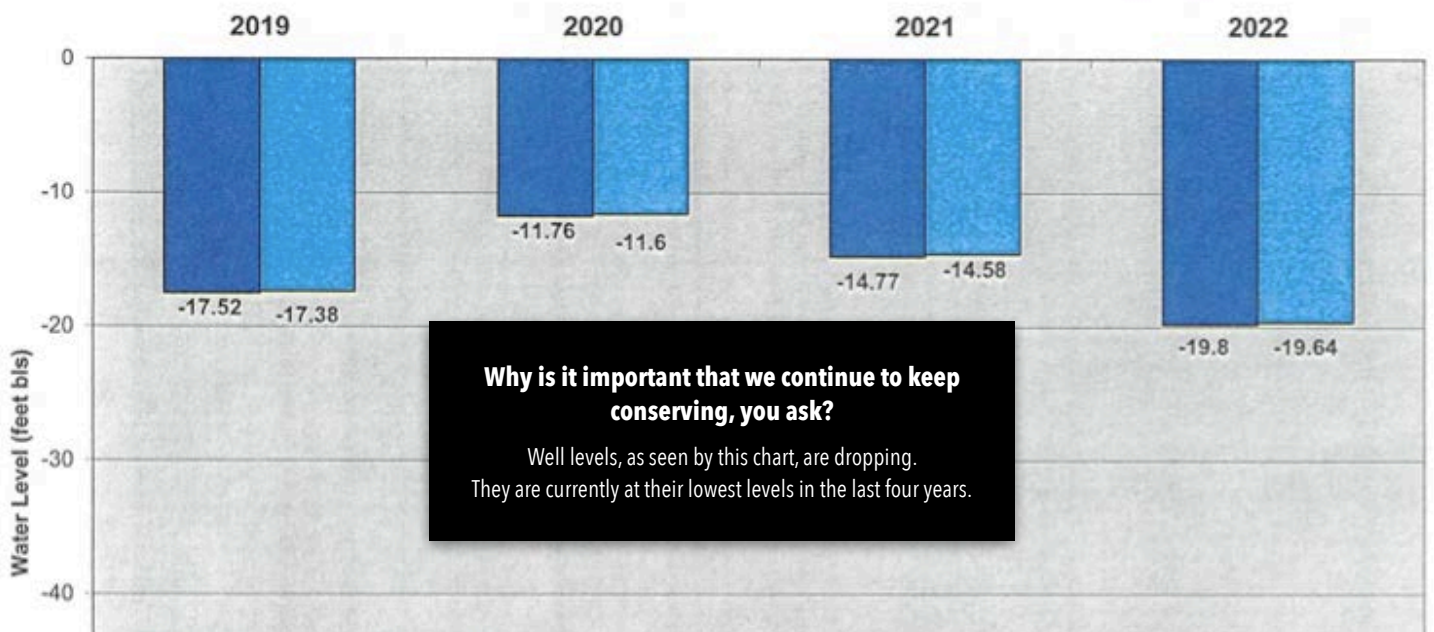
March 1 - April 30

water only 3x per week and never on Sundays

Overwatering is one of the most common ways we waste water, so please follow the mandatory seasonal watering restrictions to save water, improve your landscape and preserve our natural spring aquifer.

- **Sara + Matthew Phillips** saved more than 75,000 gallons by taking a multi-level approach. They **followed seasonal watering schedules, fixed a few leaks** and changed their **water filters**.
- **Christie + Trey Breeden** have decided to **remove most of their grass**, so they stopped watering it last year, saving more than 80,000 gallons!
- **Mary Hager gave her old irrigation system a much-needed tune up**, fixing so many leaks that she saved more than 125,000 gallons of water.
- **Kert Kley** saved 91,000 gallons by **paying more attention to what his garden and yard needed**. He greatly reduced his watering of both after learning they did not need as much as he'd thought. He also fixed irrigation leaks!
- **Carmen + Dave** sought professional help to irrigate their many orchard trees, **creating multiple watering zones** to maximize the plants' intake, while minimizing water waste.

CertainTeed recently awarded a \$2500 grant to the Cottonwood Springs Water Stewards for our ongoing restoration of the Cottonwood Springs Riparian Area. The Stewards are working closely with BLM and local land owners to remove invasive Tamarisk and regenerate the springs. Last spring some of the tamarisk was removed, and a future removal is planned for **Saturday, April 23 at 8 am**
